We are writing to inform you that Actelis Networks, Inc. will be sending notice to 2 New Hampshire addresses advising them that the company recently discovered the theft of two safes containing password-protected computer files with human resource records. The affected information included name, contact information, and social security numbers.

We have contacted and are working with law enforcement. We have no evidence or reason to believe that any of the affected information has been misused. To assist your residents with their efforts to protect themselves, we have arranged to make credit monitoring and related identity theft prevention and detection services available to them at no cost.

The notices will be sent via first class mail to the affected New Hampshire residents on December 14, 2013. Please call me if you have any questions.

Dear [ADDRESSEE],

We write to inform you about the recent theft of two locked safes that contained password-protected files that occurred on approximately December 7 or 8, 2013. The stolen files may have contained some of your personal information, including your name, contact information, and social security number which Actelis maintains in connection with employment and related business purposes.

A police report was filed concerning the theft and we are cooperating with law enforcement. We have no evidence or reason to believe that any of the information contained in the password protected files has been misused. However, because you are in a position to further protect against any potential misuse of your personal information, we wanted to inform you of the situation and encourage you to take steps you deem appropriate to help protect yourself. To assist you with these efforts, we arranged to make credit monitoring and identity theft protection available to you at no cost for one year. If you are interested in this service, please contact our HR department at [lcrisp@actelis.com](mailto:lcrisp@actelis.com) by December 31, 2013 for enrollment instructions and a redemption code.

**How You Can Protect Yourself:**

To assist you in protecting yourself, with this letter we provide general information which may be useful to you in analyzing what precautionary steps you may want to take.

Although we have no reason to believe your information is at risk, access to personal information by others is increasingly of public concern. The following resources contain information that you may find useful:

The law entitles you to receive a free copy of your credit report annually from each of the three major credit reporting bureaus. We also recommend that you consider a review of your credit report from each of the three major credit reporting agencies: Experian, Equifax, and Transunion (contact information provided below). When you receive your credit report, review it carefully. You should notify the credit bureaus of any inaccuracies in your report as soon as possible so the information can be investigated and, if found to be in error, corrected. If you discover

unauthorized accounts or charges on your credit reports, you should immediately notify the appropriate credit bureau by telephone and in writing. If you find suspicious activity on your credit reports or have reason to believe your information is being misused, notify local law enforcement and file a police report. You should obtain a copy of the police report as many creditors require the information it contains before they will absolve you of the fraudulent debts.
