Re: Notice pursuant to RSA 359-C:20, I(b)

Dear Ms. Noether:

I am writing to provide notice pursuant to the requirements of RSA 359-C:20, I (b) concerning an incident that occurred on May 21, 2007 at the Manchester, New Hampshire offices of OfficeTeam. OfficeTeam provides staffing services in the placement of administrative and office support professionals. On Monday evening, May 21, 2007, a staffing professional of OfficeTeam sent an email to a number of individuals that was intended to inform the individuals of available job opportunities through OfficeTeam. Unfortunately, and inadvertently, the email communication included the email addresses and social security numbers of all of the individuals to whom the email was originally sent. The email was sent to 237 New Hampshire residents. OfficeTeam has fully reviewed the situation and has confirmed that the information was not sent to anyone other than those listed in the email and that no other personal information was disclosed.

On May 23, 2007, OfficeTeam managers telephoned all of the affected individuals who were sent the inadvertent email to apprise them of the situation, leaving messages for those whom they were not able to reach directly. In addition, RHI sent a letter by overnight delivery on May 24, 2007 to all of the individuals. Team has arranged for all of the individuals in New Hampshire who were sent the email to receive a credit monitoring product at OfficeTeam's cost for a period of 24 months. In addition to credit monitoring, the offered service provides for identity theft insurance and access to fraud resolution representatives.
