Dear Sir/Madam:

Praxair Healthcare Services, Inc. (“PHS”) experienced a theft of a company computer on February 18, 2010. The computer’s hard drive contained the personal information of 1 New Hampshire resident. However, there is no evidence to date that the resident’s personal information has been misused in any way. Furthermore, the computer was physically damaged immediately prior to being stolen and, based on the results of our internal forensic investigation, we believe that the misuse of the customer’s personal information resulting from this incident is unlikely. Nevertheless, because the damaged computer was not entirely recovered and we cannot forensically rule out the possibility, even though remote, that the data contained on the hard drive was rendered inaccessible due to the extent of the damage, we have provided the customer with notification of the incident out of an abundance of caution.

Attached please find a copy of the letter we have mailed to the 1 New Hampshire resident. As you will see, the letter provides the resident with information as to how to protect him/herself against the possibility of identity theft. The letter also includes the contact information for the three credit reporting agencies, as well as a dedicated 800-number and email address for PHS.



Dear Valued Client/Customer:

We are writing to notify you that Praxair Healthcare Services, Inc. ("PHS") experienced a theft of a company computer on February 18, 2010. The computer's hard drive contained a limited amount of your protected health information, including your name and one or more of the following: your address, phone number, social security number, insurance provider name and policy number, or medical diagnostic code. The computer was physically damaged immediately prior to being stolen and, based on the results of our internal forensic investigation, we believe that the misuse of your personal or health information resulting from this incident is unlikely. However, because the damaged computer was not entirely recovered and we cannot forensically rule out the possibility, even though remote, that the data contained on the hard drive was rendered inaccessible due to the extent of the damage, we are providing you with this notification out of an abundance of caution.

PHS is taking this matter very seriously and has conducted a thorough investigation in addition to the investigation conducted by local law enforcement officials. Please be assured that we continue to take all reasonable steps to mitigate the circumstances resulting from this incident and to protect your personal and health information from any potential risks in the future.

There is no evidence to date that your personal or health information has been misused in any way. Nonetheless, we understand the concern that this situation may cause you and want to provide you this notification so that you can be vigilant in monitoring your financial accounts and credit reports in order to protect yourself against the possibility of identity theft.
