Dear New Hampshire Attorney General:

We are writing to notify you of a potential security breach involving one New Hampshire resident.

Please be advised that there has been a potential security breach involving a New Hampshire resident who is a customer of our business partner, Suntrust Loan Education. The individual's information is as follows:

This individual is being notified of the potential breach by Suntrust on 12/24/12 and is being offered a year of credit monitoring. First Marblehead was notified of the potential breach when contacted by the Everett Police Department here in Massachusetts. While executing a search warrant of the home of a former contractor for First Marblehead, the Everett Police discovered loan documents pertaining to First Marblehead and Suntrust Loan Education. The Everett Police Department has contacted the potential victim. The breach was discovered by First Marblehead on 10/31/12. First Marblehead does not know the details of the specific documents allegedly found as documents have not been released to First Marblehead.
