Timeline (Approx.)

- 1822: 260 signs off with DTF
- 1822: Shots fired officers down
- 1825: Two officers en route to PRH
- 1832: 260 hit and unresponsive
- 1837: Subject barricaded in basement
- 1857: Atty. Jeffco advises he can arrange surrender
- 1906: 260 loaded into Bearcat
- 2008: Text from Tibbetts intended for her mother
- 0429: All non-state police units clear



DTF Evacuation

- ❖ 1st Evac: Kukesh and Turner by Hartmann
- ❖ 2nd Evac: Murphy and Kulberg by Law



Firearms

- .357 and 9mm only firearms in residence
- .357 purchased by Tibbetts at Manchester Gun Show (Purchased with .380, not recovered)
- 9mm purchased by Mutrie's father, Charles, in 1989



Shots Fired

- 4 Rounds expended from .357 (1 live round recovered)
 - JME-1 (Murphy) & MGB-76 (Volks) .357 rounds
- Numerous rounds returned from Law Enforcement
- 4 Rounds from 9 mm
 - 1 Round hit Tibbetts consistent with 9 mm
 - 2 Rounds out basement window (1 Struck Chief Maloney)
 - 1 Round used in Mutrie suicide



Who Shot Who and How Do We Know

- DTF: statements that Mutrie in doorway shooting at Detectives
- Chief Maloney: statement by Mutrie that he'd shot 2 officers, height of shot from basement window & Mutrie is in possession of 9mm at the time of his death
- Tibbetts: shot left to right at a downward angle
 - Dog leash on left hand, left hand braced on floor
- Mutrie: left to right, contact wound and 9 mm in lap
 - Mutrie scuff mark inside right forearm, consistent with bullet



Residence Security

- Camera on porch
- No evidence of recordings and or surveillance software on computers



Narcotics/Money in Residence

- Cocaine (27.46 grams)
- Anabolic steroids (3 vials)
- Marijuana (5.78 grams)
- Mushrooms (7.79 grams)
- No narcotics in vehicles
- Approx. \$14,000 cash found on Tibbetts
 - Majority in bra



Last Known Contact

- Phone call by Mutrie to Shane Bateman:

Shane said that he had spoken to Mutrie after the shooting and Mutrie admitted that he shot two cops and that he may have killed them. Mutrie also made statements indicating that he was not going to come out of the residence.
- Text sent from Tibbetts phone:

"I love u too so much. More than I'll ever know we didn't do anything wrong!! I love u and dad and Linds and gram and gramps soooo much!!! Diesel will need you!!! Ok take care of him!!!!!! I'm so sorry!!! Good bye!!! 517 post rd Greenland. Take Whiskey too bye mom I love you soooo much!!!!!!!!!!"

Tibbetts had evidence of narcotics, opiates and marijuana in her system at the time of autopsy

































